Seedsticks are a great way to get young kids into nature. They are ideal for little gardeners who typically have problems 'pinching' tiny seeds with their fingers and losing the seeds. Seedstick class planting packs are perfect for PreK, Kindie and early learners. They are a fun, easy and inclusive way to involve the entire class in learning about nature and taking an active role in its care. First, what are Seedsticks?

Seeds are glued to 5 biodegradable cardboard sticks ready to plant. Each 5 stick packet has full growing instructions and plant information.

What are Seedsticks Class Planting Packs?

Seedsticks make a great planting activity and our Seedsticks Class Planting Packs include 30 individual packs – enough for a class of 30 or less to take part.

How do you plant a Seedstick?

You will need a container or pot with drainage holes; many of our teachers reuse egg cartons. Add some potting mix and then remove each stick from its pack and push it point first into the seed raising mixture. The depth line on each stick shows the optimum planting depth for the seeds to germinate.
